



MRSS Term 1 Curriculum Overview: Prep



English



In this unit, students listen to and read a variety of everyday texts to learn about predictable text structures and common visual patterns. Learning happens through focused teaching, play, real-life situations, helping children build early language, literacy and comprehension skills.

Assessment: Sharing likes and dislikes to characters and events.

Mode: Oral

Maths



In this unit, students learn to recognise and continue repeating patterns, collect and sort data to answer simple questions, and explore familiar shapes. They practise explaining their thinking as they create, compare and sort shapes in everyday learning contexts.

Assessment: Students will complete short answer questions

Mode: Practical + interview.

Science



In this unit, students exploring the natural world by asking questions, making observations, and using their senses. They learn how scientists and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples observe, record and share knowledge about plants and animals through stories, drawings, photographs, reports and creative expression.

Assessment: Students learning will be monitored throughout the term

Mode: Practical.

HASS



In this unit, students explore their family histories and celebrations by sharing stories, comparing the past and present, and learning about the people, events and traditions.

Assessment: Students will be monitored throughout the Semester

HPE



In this unit, students explore how to move and play safely during physical activity. They develop the fundamental movement skills of running, jumping, hopping and galloping. They apply fundamental movement skills and solve movement challenges.

Assessment: Students will demonstrate their knowledge and skills.

Mode: Practical.

Technologies



In this unit, students explore how plants and animals are grown for food, clothing and shelter, and learn how farms help meet people's needs. They investigate healthy food choices, design simple solutions to farm-based problems, and follow steps to prepare a healthy snack through hands-on learning.

Assessment: Students will design and produce a scarecrow.
Mode: Practical

The Arts



In Music, students explore songs, rhymes and chants about different places, from familiar environments to places far away.

Assessment: Students will perform music using different musical expressions.

In Visual Art unit, students will explore colour and create artworks to represent experiences, observations and imagination.
Assessment: Students will create artworks to represent colour experiences.
