



MRSS Term 1 Curriculum Overview: Yr 1



English



In this unit, students listen to, read and view a range of picture books, including stories from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures, and practise retelling familiar stories using repetition and clear text structure.

Assessment: To share ideas and express an opinion about a character.
Mode: Written.

Maths



In this unit, students explore number concepts by breaking apart one and two digit numbers, creating skip counting and repeating patterns, and identifying the repeating unit. They collect, record and compare simple data using one-to-one displays and everyday language.

Assessment: Students will complete a range of short answer questions.
Mode: Practical + short answer.

Science



In this unit, students explore daily and seasonal weather changes and learn how these affect their everyday lives. They sort and record weather data using simple tables and diagrams, make basic predictions, and use everyday and scientific language to share their observations and ideas.

Assessment: Students will collect data and create a weather report.
Mode: Short answer.

HASS



In this unit, students explore how their family and daily life have changed over time by learning about family roles, important events and meaningful dates. They compare past and present experiences, use family stories and objects as sources.

Assessment: Students will identify, describe and sequence events over time.
Mode: Investigation

HPE



In this unit students will demonstrate aquatic skills and strokes in a variety of movement sequences and situations. They will develop strategies for safe participation in and around the pool.

Assessment: Students will demonstrate their knowledge and skills.
Mode: Practical + short answer.

The Arts



In this Art unit, students explore how emotions can be shown in portraits by experimenting with drawing and painting techniques.
Assessment: Students will create portraits that show emotion.

In Music, students explore songs, rhymes and chants about different places, from familiar environments to places far away.

Assessment: Students will perform music using different musical expressions.
