



MRSS Term 1 Curriculum Overview: Yr 2



English



In this unit, students will share ideas and respond to imaginative texts by exploring characters and settings through reading, viewing, and comprehending a range of texts. Students will also develop their speaking skills and features of voice.

Assessment: To create a presentation to share ideas about a character.
Mode: Oral and written

Maths



In this unit, students use place value to partition, rearrange and rename two-digit numbers, and apply this understanding to addition and subtraction within 20. They also identify dates and events using calendars and collect, record, represent and interpret categorical data to answer questions.

Assessment: Students demonstrate their ability to apply knowledge.
Mode: Practical + short answer.

Science



In this unit, students identify objects in the sky and describe patterns they observe. They explore how science is used in everyday life, sort and represent data to show patterns, and use everyday and scientific language to share their observations and ideas.

Assessment: Students will identify and describe celestial objects and predict patterns
Mode: Practical + Short answer.

HASS



In this unit, students explore how people are connected to places locally and globally, using maps and data to understand these connections. They also consider ways to preserve significant places, including those important to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Assessment: Students will sort and record data on maps and describe places of significance.
Mode: Multimodal.

HPE



In this Physical Education unit, students demonstrate aquatic skills and strokes in a variety of movement sequences and situations.

Assessment: Students will demonstrate their knowledge and skills.
Mode: Practical

The Arts



In this Art unit, students use imaginative and abstract art techniques to express their connection to real and imagined places.

Assessment: Students will create artworks in different forms to express their ideas.
In Music, students explore songs, rhymes and chants about different places, from familiar environments to places far away.
Assessment: Students will perform music using different musical expressions.
